

Baby clients hope to build a forest

When the Natural Fertility Clinic decided to plant a tree for every baby born to parents being treated at the clinic, father-to-be Jonathan Stross agreed to match it.

Jonathan, Director of Sponsor Trees, was so touched by the success stories at the Warrington clinic that he decided to play his part. The clinic, run by Tracey Turton, helps couples to conceive using natural therapies.
